





We know that historical and structural inequities have placed some of our children in situations of greater stress, trauma, and violence. Thus, trauma-informed practice that heals kids exemplifies equitable practice. I want to highlight Resilient Southern Illinois, one partnership that is supporting this healing by addressing students' unique needs. The innovative collaboration includes the Poshard Foundation for Abused Children, Illinois Education Association and Partnership for Resilience, and more than 15 school districts in Southern Illinois. Educators and staff in participating schools are provided with ongoing training and resources as they build relationships to support students experiencing trauma and nurture students' social-emotional development.

Resilient Southern Illinois speaks to the necessity of being in deeper relationships to care for the whole child, whole school, and whole community. Children are not preordained to be defined by their trauma. Mitigating buffers and protective factors can help children heal and overcome any ACEs score. People read over trauma-informed practice and do not understand how fundamentally important it is. Trauma-informed classrooms are places where all children are getting their needs met. We firmly believe that trauma-informed practice benefits every single child and adult in the classroom and in the school.

Our alternative and safe schools are partnering with Resilient Southern Illinois, where our staff participates in training and the implementation of trauma informed practices. We are transforming our schools with the knowledge and best practices to meet the social emotional and educational needs to best support our students.

# Community Prevention Resources (CPR)

This grant was funded beginning 8/1/17 and is a direct service sub-grant of FJMW ROE 21. CPR is funded for 2 two full time educators. Kate West, Director and Whitney Roberts, Project Manager.




The purpose of grant is Addiction Prevention, with three defined goals:

- Reduce the past 30-day alcohol rates among 8th-12th graders
- Reduce the non-medical use of prescription drugs among 8th-12th graders and adults
- Increase IYS participation (schools and number of students)

ROE 21 has been funded to provide PRESCRIBED evidence-based services in <u>Franklin and Saline Counties</u>. These services are limited to:

- Deliver evidence-based Youth Prevention Education model program aimed at reducing alcohol use with 7th and 8th grade students in West Frankfort Central Junior High, Harrisburg Middle School, and Eldorado Middle School (8th grade only).
- Implement and maintain two communication campaigns addressing the contributing factors related to past 30-day alcohol use and non-medical use of prescription drugs.
- One campaign focused on youth and the other on parents in West Frankfort Central Junior High, Harrisburg Middle School, and Eldorado Middle School.
- Engage with local school districts to review 2018 Illinois Youth Survey (IYS) results to inform local prevention strategies and encourage 2020 IYS participation.
- Works in partnership with the Center for Prevention Research and Development (U of I Chicago) who is the state contractor for the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS).
- Conduct two activities that focus and are designed to raise community awareness regarding
  - 1. Underage drinking and alcohol misuse
  - 2. Prescription and opioid drug use that match the daily health themes according to the

Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's National Prevention Week schedule.

- Raise Awareness regarding the drug take-back programs in the service area.
- Maintain and enhance a Youth Advisory Committee.
- Maintain and Update Resource Guide that identifies all substance use disorder treatment and human service organizations.
- Additional funding this spring to implement the My Generation RX Toolkit for 250 7th and 8th grade students. The mission of Generation Rx is to educate people of all ages about the potential dangers of misusing prescription medications.







# Franklin County Regional Delivery System for Career and Technical Education (FCRDS-CTE)

FJMW Regional Office of Education serves as Fiscal Agent for the Franklin County CTE cooperative. The programs are funded by Federal Perkins Grant and CTEI Grant. Cooperating school districts include Benton Consolidated H.S., Christopher H.S., Frankfort Community H.S., Sesser-Valier H.S., Thompsonville H.S., and Zeigler-Royalton H.S.





FRCDS-CTE operates three "Regional" CTE classes...available\* to Franklin County students:

- --Don Wilburn is the CTE Instructor for FCRDS Building Trades Regional Class serving students in the 2018-19 school year from Christopher, Sesser, and Benton. Projects of note: Construction of walls and soffits for a non-profit; on-site walls and ceilings for Ewing Government Offices; 12x20 storage facility.
- --Kevin Weston serves as the Instructor for the Computer Assisted Drafting Regional Class (potentially students from throughout county but particularly West Frankfort, Zeigler, and Thompsonville).
- --Lee Messersmith is the teacher/facilitator of Entrepreneurial Development, Growth and Education (EDGE) Class (the study of entrepreneurship).

The Franklin County Regional Delivery System supports programs in Agricultural Education, Business, Marketing, and Computer Education, Family and Consumer Sciences, Technology and Engineering, Health Science Technology.

Programs are supported through state and federal grants designed to supplement CTE programs. Allowable expenditures for these grants include: Instructional materials, instructional equipment (capital outlay); partial salary payments to districts to help ensure affordability of qualified instruction; tutorial services; and improvement of instruction activities.

The Franklin County Regional Delivery System for CTE funds also provide supplemental funds for (K-8) Career Exploration programs at Akin CCSD 91, Benton CCSD 47, Christopher CUSD 99, Ewing-Northern CCSD 115, Frankfort CUSD 168, Sesser-Valier CUSD 196, Thompsonville CUSD 174, and Zeigler-Royalton CUSD 188.

FCRDS also conducts Workshops and hosts ISBE-sponsored professional development for educators in Franklin and Jefferson Counties per the CTE/Perkins Programs of Study requirements. FCRDS for CTE prepares and submits to Illinois State Board of Education various reports regarding program operation, assessment, and improvement.

Over the past few years the students have built and sold a Tiny House and built items for the Benton Library Garden, including a 12'x16' storage facility.

#### Grants Managed and Status for FY 2018

\$248,288 CTEI Grant Allotment shows a decrease from last year's original and amended application amount, but we may see additional monies become available as they did last year. This grant has been approved by ISBE. As of 12-5-2018, all funds have been received from this state grant. The grant ended on August 31, 2018.


\$89,021 in Federal Perkins Grant This federal allocation represents a \$1,615 decrease in last year's amount. This grant has been approved by ISBE. This grant ended on June 30, 2018 and all funds have been received and expended.

#### ALLOCATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019

Fiscal Year 2019 CTEI Grant Allocation is \$245,362. The FY 19 CTEI Grant has been written, submitted, and approved by ISBE. As of 3-31-19, \$125,000 has been received from ISBE (through November-2018 payments)

Fiscal Year 2019 Perkins Grant Allocation is \$89,369. This grant has also been prepared, submitted, and approved by ISBE. As of 3-31-19, \$43,469 has been received in reimbursement from ISBE.

Per Intergovernmental Coop Agreement regulations and Board of Control authorization, CTE Director Hopkins published notice of Joint Agreement Budget on review 30 days in advance of hearing. Hearing was conducted at 10 a.m. on 8/30/18, at Regional Office of Education 21.
