## Ordinance No. 2011 - 08

#### Inmate Processing Fees

WHEREAS, Pursuant to 55ILCS 5/4-5001, Franklin County, Illinois is defined as a county of the second class; and

WHEREAS, 55 ILCS 5/4-5001 sets the amount of fees to be collected by the Sheriff in counties of the second class; and

WHEREAS, 55ILCS 5/4-5001 allows a county board to increase such fees to an amount sufficient to cover the cost of providing such services; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of Franklin County that revenues sufficient to pay for services received be provided.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Franklin County Board of Franklin County, Illinois; that the following ordinance be and hereby is adopted:

- 1. That in accord with 55 ILCS 5/4-5001, the following fee shall be increased to the amount set forth herein:
  - a. Inmate Processing Fees \$20.00
- 2. That fees, collected for these services collected from any officer, agency, department or other instrumentality of the State of Illinois shall remain as set by 55 ILCS 5/4-5001.
  - 3. That these fees will become effective January 1, 2012.
- 4. That this fee shall establish and provide the Inmate Processing Fee to be used by the Franklin County Sheriff's office.
- 5. That in the event any provision of this ordinance shall be found to be invalid by ruling of judicial authority, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

#### Findings:

After—review—of—all—information—supplied—by—the—Franklin—Gounty—Sheriff s Department, it appears that the Franklin County Sheriff's Department currently charges a base fee of \$36.75 for in office and Benton delivery and \$36.75 plus mileage for all other parts of the County. The calculated cost of the Franklin County Sheriff's Department processing (1) civil service document is \$57.59. This represents a difference of \$20.84 for civil service documents served. The estimated number of billable civil service documents delivered for the years examined was 800 documents per year. The increase of \$20.84 per civil service document delivered would total \$16,672 of increased fees based on the average number of 800 billable civil service documents served per year.

### PROCEDURES AND FINDINGS FOR INMATE BOND PROCESSING FEES

#### Procedure:

We requested the employees involved in the Franklin County Sheriff's inmate bond processing collect data indentifying their time spent on providing inmate bond functions.

#### Finding:

The Franklin County Sheriff's Department's employees involved in the immate bond processing function provided us with the requested information concerning the time spent by employees on the inmate bond processing function.

#### Procedure:

We reviewed and analyzed the data collected regarding the inmate bond processing function.

#### Finding:

The review and analysis of the data collected produced a cost per inmate bond processed.

#### Procedure:

We reviewed the applicable state statutes that disclose allowable fees for the Franklin County Sheriff's Department.

#### Finding:

We found that 55 ILCS 5/4-5001 listed \$1 per inmate bond processed as the allowable charge unless a cost study was performed in accordance with OMB Circular A-87 and that study showed a cost of greater than \$1 per document to perform inmate bond processing.

#### Procedure:

We obtained and reviewed building overhead costs associated with the inmate bond processing function.

#### Finding:

Building-overhead-costs-were-allocated on the basis of square footage used by the inmate bond processing function as compared to the total square footage of the Franklin-County-Sheriff's Department.

#### Procedure:

We inquired as to when the current fees were last reviewed

#### Finding:

It did not appear that the current inmate bond processing fees had previously been reviewed with a cost study conducted in compliance with OMB Circular A-87.

#### Procedure:

We inquired about the number of inmate bonds being processed annually by the Franklin County Sheriff's Department.

#### Finding:

For the year ended November 30, 2009, the Franklin County Sheriff's Department processed 3,000 inmate bonds.

#### Procedure:

We requested information for all employees involved with providing the inmate/bond processing function and inquired as to the allocable time percentage for each employee.

#### Finding:

Upon inquiry, the Franklin County Sheriff's Department provided us with estimate of the sindividual employees' percentages of time allocated to the inmate bond processing function.

#### Procedure:

We requested the cost of the equipment used in the Franklin County Sheriff Department's inmate bond processing function.



Franklin County - \$50.00 - \$60.00 (flat rate)

Hamilton County - \$39.00 plus \$0.50 per mile

Jefferson County - \$45.00 plus \$0.50 per mile

Perry County - \$51.00 - \$68.00 (flat rate)

Saline - \$35.00 - \$48.00 (flat rate)

White – \$35.00 – plus \$1.00 per mile

Williamson - \$40.00 - \$47.00 (flat rate)

The counties with a flat rate collect their fees up front and the fees are determined by a base rate, plus mileage to the city of the defendant. In turn, the flat rate is a much simpler way of collecting fees.
