Federal Inmate Holding:

I am still in the process of increasing our "per day cost" of federal inmate holding. It is currently \$60.00 per day and we have requested an increase to \$85.00 per day. The increase in food and labor costs has allowed most jails in our area to successfully negotiate this increase. I'm hoping to have this new rate in place prior to next years budget. I will keep the board informed on this process.

Inmate Healthcare Changes (Potential):

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS), the State Medicaid Agency, recently received approval from Federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) for an 1115 waiver that will expand Medicaid payment for healthcare services provided in jails prior to release. Section 1115 of the Social Security Act allows CMS to approve state demonstration projects to make changes to eligibility, benefits, provider payments, and other Medicaid rules.

Illinois received approval for Medicaid Pre-Release Services, which allows Illinois to partially waive the inmate exclusion policy. This policy usually prevents Medicaid from paying for services provided during incarceration, except for inpatient services.

If implemented, jails can provide healthcare services such as care management in the 90 days prior to release to assist Medicaid-enrolled detainees at the time of re-entry and the services will be paid by Medicaid. Services like medications (including long-acting injectable medications), nursing time to administer the medication, and substance use counseling will be covered by Medicaid in the 90 days prior to release.

HFS is still working with CMS to develop an Implementation Plan that will have additional details about how jails can access these services. The due date to develop the plan is December 29, 2024. HFS plans to pilot this program in the Cook County jail and within IDOC prior to any other Illinois jails.
