

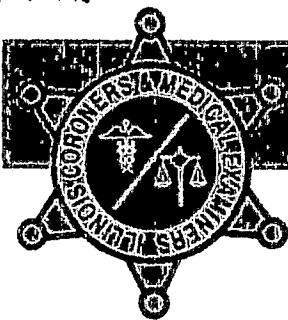

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Proposed MOU to Bargaining Unit Contract, Applicable to Members Classified as Deputy Sheriff, Corrections Officer or Dispatcher:

Sign on Bonus: 3 yr Employment Contract - ~~\$7,000.00~~ ^{1/6 7}
5 yr Employment Contract - ~~\$10,000.00~~ ^{1/2 10}

The sign on bonus will be accompanied with requirements such as completion of academy work, FTO training and successful completion of a 12 month probation period. Payments could be scattered based on these accomplishments by the employee. I understand that our main issue of recruitment and retention is in the patrol deputy classification and that the board may wish to only offer the sign on bonus to those prospective employees.

Education / Military Incentive Pay: 3% Associates Degree or 2 yrs Prior Military Service
6% Bachelors Degree or 4 yrs Prior Military Service

Shift Differential Pay: Working hours between 9 pm - 7 am (% above base)

It is noted that the dispatcher agreements will no longer be in effect upon the establishment of the consolidated dispatch center.

Specific language concerning each incentive is being researched and will be in MOU.
