Subject: Client Notification: ADA & MAT

Good afternoon,

Lawsuits are now being filed against correctional facilities regarding the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT).

The EEOC and at least some US Attorneys take the position that opioid use disorder (OUD) is a covered disability under the ADA. This does not automatically mean detainees get whatever medication they claim to be taking. Someone who is on MAT as part of a recovery program for OUD may be “disabled,” but a detainee who has been taking drugs illegally is not “disabled” under the ADA.

ACH allows an “individualized determination” by a qualified provider. As a general rule:

1. **Detainees who come into jail and are not current on their MAT program** won’t necessarily have their MAT continued (i.e., if they abandoned their MAT in the community, they have no right to demand that it be reinstated immediately in jail). They should receive appropriate individualized treatment based upon the prescriber’s independent professional medical judgment of that specific detainee’s factual situation and circumstances.
2. **Detainees who come into jail and are current on their MAT program** may be continued on MAT (as appropriate). It’s appropriate to confirm that detainees are actually on MAT and current with their program – for example, if they abandoned their MAT in the community, and it were reinstated in jail, they could overdose. Again, they should receive appropriate individualized treatment based upon the prescriber’s independent professional medical judgment of that specific detainee’s factual situation and circumstances.

A lot of the lawsuits that we see on drug withdrawal or treatment are based upon making a detainee withdraw “cold turkey” in the jail – which we avoid with appropriate medical treatment. Detainees have a Constitutional right to access MAT when it is clinically-indicated, so facilities should not have blanket “no MAT” policies (for a program guide, use the [MAT for OUD in Jails and Prisons Toolkit](#)).
